Are making up a square.


The "Twirlers" are no exception

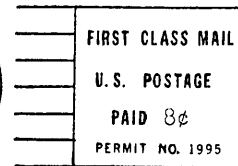
