

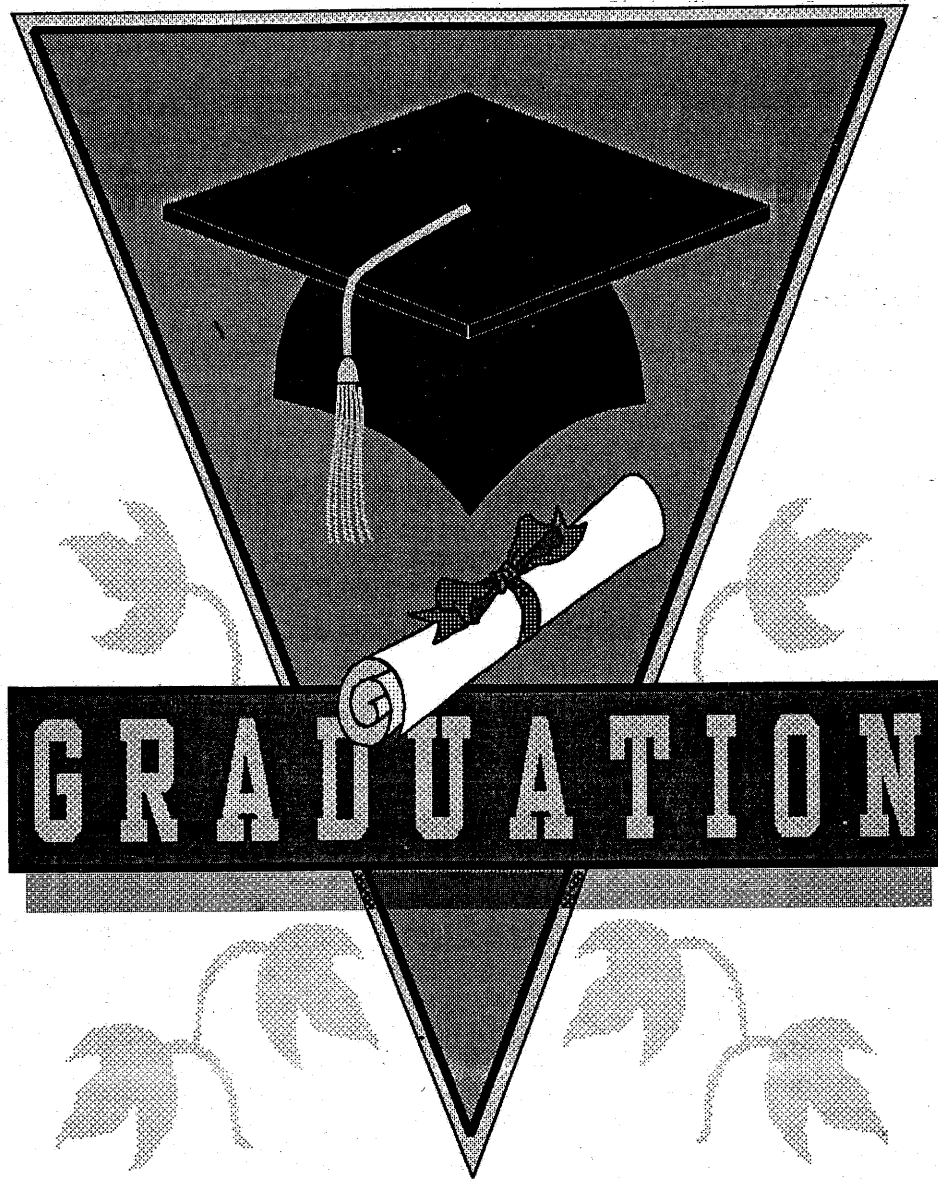

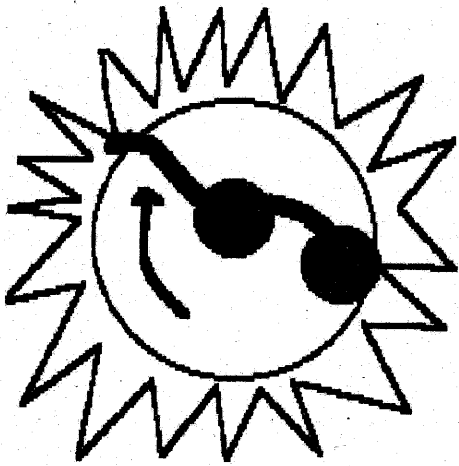

Please remember to participate in the survey about square dance levels that your President received. Your vote is important as it will help to determine the future of square dancing.

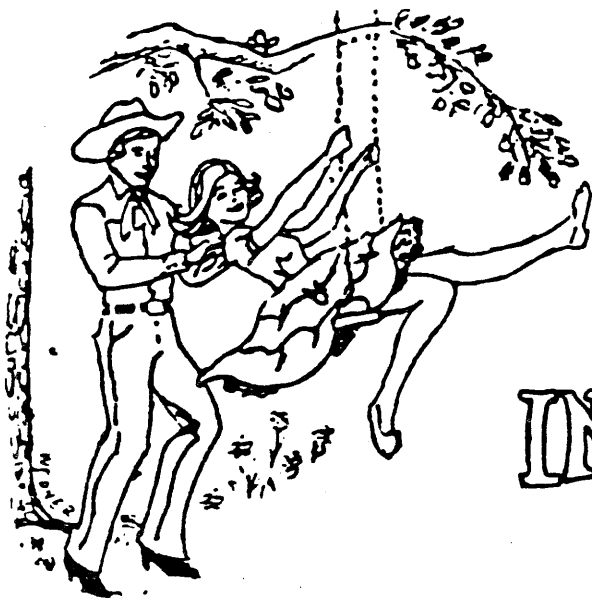

Spring has finally arrived and it is the time to renew acquaintances with friends who have been hibernating. Here is a super side dish to be served when your special friends come for dinner.

FIVE FRIED ONION MASHED POTATOES

The five onions are: shallots, leek, scallions, chives and red onion. For 5 lbs. of potatoes, you're going to need at least 4 cups of these. The shallots should be cut in half and then made into long shreds; the leek (white part only) should be cut into very thin julienned strips; the scallions (use the white and lots of the green) should be cut into 1/4" pieces; the chives (snipped in 1/4" pieces) and finally the red onions (sliced in half the long way) and then into very fine slices.

Add 2 tbsp. butter and 2 tbsp. olive oil to a large hot skillet. When melted and hot, add all the onions, except the chives, and saute' on high heat. Shake the pan and move the onions around in the skillet to insure all the pieces are coated with the oil. Add more butter if needed. The flavor will be worth the calories. When the onions are a deep golden brown, add the chives, toss to coat with the butter mixture and then remove from heat and set aside.

Peel 5 lbs. of potatoes, cut into small pieces and cook in boiling salted water until tender. Drain potatoes and mash. Add about 1 cup hot milk and at least 1/4 lb. melted butter, salt & pepper to taste. Whip the potatoes and adjust the seasoning. You might want to add more melted butter. Add the browned onions, stirring them in by hand, making sure they are well incorporated. Taste again and serve.

NOTE: I suggest you make much more than you think you might need. These disappear from the pot they're made in. They're that good!

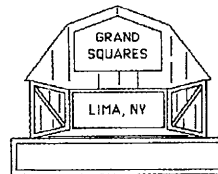


Have you ever said to yourself "One of these days, when I learn to be a better seamstress, I'll get a better sewing machine," or "One of these days when I learn to use all the stitches on this machine, I'll get a fancier one"? It will never happen! Think instead that with a better machine you'll BE a better seamstress and maybe the reason you don't use the options on your present machine is that they are awkward and not dependable. Don't use precious sewing time struggling with a balky machine. If it jams frequently, won't hold the correct tension or timing, won't sew a straight seam without a fight, it's time to start shopping for a new one. And don't just shop for a machine—shop for a dealer. Someone who is willing to take the time and help you become acquainted with the machine so you can use it to its full potential.

Another small tool for your sewing collection is called a Fasturn. This is a set of turning tubes and wires that allows you to make the small filled fabric tubes that can be braided to make a belt and bolo slide to match your square dance dresses.

And for a time-saver when cutting out square dance outfits, get a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler. You'll find it makes the boring job of cutting all those ruffle strips go much faster.

Remember, the workman is only as good as her tools, and checking out the new tools available for your sewing will be time well spent.

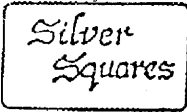


HERE'S THE LATEST FROM THE ROVING REPORTER:
